Herald

Greetings all!

As year's end approaches, I'd like everyone take a minute to go outside, anywhere outside where you can just stand for a minute without answering any questions or making a decision or intervening in some squabble, a minute for you.

Look up and whether its a star or a tree or a cloud, look at the first thing your eyes land on. Take a deep breath and let your mind wander, contemplating this simple moment in which you are doing essentially NOTHING. Savor this minute and remember it well, for it will probably be your last until after Gulf Wars.

When you are finished wasting precious time, get back inside and consult with the Unocular Oracle and take a look at <http://heraldry.ansteorra.org/gazette/>.

The Ansteorran Gazette is a monthly newsletter for the heralds and scribes of Ansteorra, available at this site in PDF format, which can be viewed with Adobe Acrobat reader, among others. It can also be subscribed to as a paper newsletter at a nominal charge.

A bit of the internal workings of SCA heraldry is in order. Those who wish to register names or devices/arms send their submissions to the Asterisk Herald, generally through their local herald, who has hopefully done conflict checking and some basic verification that the research presented by the member is in good order. Please note that this does not necessarily be that the research is factually correct, only that the forms are filled out correctly and glaring problems are filtered out.

Asterisk, Ansteorra's Head Honcho Herald creates an Internal Letter of Intent (ILoI) to register those items. The ILoI is published in the Gazette to generate commentary by the heraldic community, which is basically people who enjoy such things cross checking all entries from their various and occasionally divergent points of view. It is in this commentary process that most heraldic problems are discovered and often suggestions are made to correct them. This commentary is published in a later Gazette, as is a list of those items which passed this Kingdom-level check and were passed on to the SCA-wide Laurel level in a external Letter of Intent (LoI), where it may still be subject to further analysis before being passed or returned. These final results are also published, as an excerpt of the Ansteorran

Speaking Forsoothly
Part Eight

Thee and Thine versus You and Yours

Art thou confounded still over the proper usage of thee, thy, thine and thou? Thou art not alone in this broil, dear friends, and I shall attempt to make the matter less murky for thee in this installment of Speaking Forsoothly.

As we have discussed before, the exposure that most people have to “speaking forsoothly” comes from the King James Bible and the works of the Bard of Stratford-Upon-Avon, William Shakespeare. Familiarity with these works, as it may be somewhat limited, has caused a common confusion, in that “thee and thou” are thought to be the formal methods of address, whereas “you” is the intimate or informal method. The fact that God and Jesus Christ are addressed as “thee” seems to support this idea.

This is not the case, however; rather, “you” is the formal address, and “thee” the informal. In the King James Bible, God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are addressed in the informal, familiar mode, indicating the personal relationship between the believer and the Godhead. But while one would address God with the personal “thee”, one had better address the earthly king or queen with the formal “you”, lest the sovereign take offence at such a display of over familiarity.

Now that we have established the formal and informal modes of address, let’s re-confuse the issue by bringing in the use of “ye”, and of “you” when addressing more than one person. Here is a review of the examples of ye, thee, thy, thine, thou, you and yours from lesson 10:

Thou wast in the pavilion. (one person, subject)
Ye were in the pavilion. (several people, subject)
I saw thee in the pavilion. (one person, object)
I saw you in the pavilion. (several people, object)
That is thy tent. (one person, possessive)
That is your tent. (several people, possessive)
That tent is thine. (one person, predicate possessive)
That tent is yours. (several people, predicate possessive)

Note that “ye” is used in place of “you” when there is more than one person and it is the subject of the verb (“Ye were”) – think “y’all” or maybe “all y’all”. When

multiple people are the object of the sentence, “you” is the proper form (“I saw you”). If the group of people is in possession of an object, use “your” (“That is your tent”). When stating that something belongs to more than one person, “yours” is the proper term (“That tent is yours”).

Clear as mud so far? Good. Let us cite more examples.

When speaking with a friend, family member, person of equivalent or lower station, one might inquire, “How dost thou this day?” When speaking with a noble, or anyone of a higher station, the question would take the form “How fare you this day, milord?”

Giving directions to a passing knight, one would say, “You must ride past the mill yonder to come to the ford in the river, Sir Knight.” Guiding one’s cow to the river to drink, however, the beast might be encouraged to keep moving with “Get thee down past the mill, now, Bessie.”

And although one addressed the Savior in the intimate mode (“Thine is the power and glory, Lord Jesus”), in Medieval times, the Church was just slightly lower in the social hierarchy than the nobility, and therefore God’s representatives on Earth were addressed formally (“I have brought your goblet, milord Bishop”).

The use of “thou” also modifies verbs, using the endings “st” or “th” (although this is not the only case for using these endings). “You were there” becomes “Thou wast there”, “Your brother throws stones” becomes “Thy brother throweth stones”, “She gives you a book” becomes “She giveth thee a book”. Again, much of this depends upon the formality of the situation: “The Lord giveth, and the Lord taketh away”, but “The Baron gives his people coins”.

One scholar notes that by King James’ time, it is believed that the “th” ending on verbs was actually pronounced “ess” rather than “eth”, and that the spelling eventually followed the sound. I feel that adhering this would remove much of the charm of trying to speak forsoothly, so I recommend that you use the “eth” instead of the “ess” sound.

Pop quiz: Try to decide where and whether to use “thee, thy, thou, thine and ye” in the short paragraph below. Or you can do it the easy way and look at the

answer.

Did I see you and your friend Bjorn at the tournament last weekend? It looked like you were walking toward the list field. Were you carrying armor? I thought I saw you holding a helm, and that you were going to enter the tourney. Was the armor his or yours? I didn't know that you had your own armor.

Now, at least try to make the substitutions before you look at the answer. Don't worry if you don't get the verb forms exact; this is an exercise in using the different forms of "thee".

Answer to quiz:

Did I see thee and thy friend Bjorn at the tournament

last weekend? It looked like ye were walking toward the list field. Wast thou carrying armor? I thought I saw thee holding a helm, and that thou wert going to enter the tourney. Was the armor his or thine? I didn't know that thou hadst thine own armor.

Like any other art, there are several places in the pop quiz paragraph where the form could be rendered differently, but this is one good example. Also like any other art, you can only improve if you put it into practice and work on it. Try speaking forsoothly for a short time each day, and attempt to translate something you are reading into a forsooth mode. Thou shalt be amazed at how quickly it becomes as second nature to thee, and soon forsooth speech shall runneth drippingly off thine tongue as though thou wast a companion of the Bard himself.
